Treasurer's Report

May 21, 2020

The Treasurer's Report for the fiscal year 2019 is included in your annual report under the Financial Statement sections. A brief review of the statistics will be given here:

NEA had total operating revenue of \$13,816,799; our expenses were \$12,702,756; which left a margin of \$1,114,043.

The Balance sheet shows that our electric plant is worth \$24,469,641, which has been depreciated to a book value of \$15,755,573. NEA has restricted funds in the amount of \$10,885,029 and general funds amounting to \$165,745. Accounts receivable, materials and supplies; along with other assets bring NEA's total Assets to \$27,201,059.

NEA's long-term debt to the Rural Utilities Service is \$2,067,558 and long-term debt to NRU-CFC and CoBank is \$3,854,883. The net long-term debt to RUS, NRU-CFC, and CoBank is \$6,922,441. Patronage Capital, other member equities and current liabilities bring the total to a balance figure of \$27,201,059.

The annual audit was completed by Decoria, Maichel & Teague, P.S. and the following are excerpts from their audit letter:

We have audited the financial statements of Niobrara Electric Association, Inc., which are comprised of the balance sheet as of December 31, 2019.

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards*, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States.

In our opinion, the financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Niobrara Electric Association, Inc. as of December 31, 2019, and the results of its operations and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
